






With the Lisbon treaty also the Charter of Fundamental Rights of the EU came into effect in 2009. The Charter is aligned to the European Convention on Human Rights of 1953. It describes human dignity as inviolable, guarantees the right to asylum and prohibits torture as well as the death penalty.





In the first European elections, EC citizens can directly vote in their members of the European Parliament. This gives the European Parliament more democratic legitimacy, but no more competences.






Austerity or investment? The European debt crisis leads to dispute over the direction the common currency policy should take. Does the Euro divide or unify the Eurozone countries?








ment announces that it won't sign the association agreement with the EU and Ukrainians start to demonstrate for a future in the EU. That day is the beginning of the so-called Euromaidan
